

⁵, *Bothriechis nubestris* was separated from *Bothriechis nigroviridis* (an extremely similar species) in July 2016. Prior to that, *B. nigroviridis* had been identified in the reserve. Photos of some of the individuals of what was thought were *B. nigroviridis* were identified by the authors of the description account as *B. nubestris*. As such, while we have confirmed the presence of *B. nubestris* in the reserve, it is now uncertain whether or not *B. nigroviridis* is present.
